

Both Courses will be offered at this event - choose the training that you need!

Volunteers needed to help staff ABQ Class - reach out to Joe at email address above if you are willing to help - Looking at early Fall for a class in Four Corners area

ILOS is required training for Scoutmasters, Venturing Advisors and their assistants and all direct contact leaders registered in Scouts BSA Troops and Crew, in order to be considered "fully trained".

BALOO is a leader training for all Cub Scout Leaders and parents that want to be ready for outdoor activities. At least one adult on a pack or Webelos/AOL Den overnight must have completed BALOO training. It is recommended to have multiple trained leaders to ensure campouts do not have to be cancelled if someone is unexpectedly unavailable.

Wilderness First Aid

LOCATION - LAS CRUCES This 16-hour course meets BSA's high-adventure requirements and is essential for adult leaders and older youth attending Philmont, Northern Tier, or other remote Scouting adventures.

You must take the online portion prior to coming for the in person portion!

Wood Badge builds upon the best traditions and experiences of the Boy Scouts of America and also draws from a wide range of courses within and beyond the bounds of Scouting to present the latest in leadership theory and team development.

The Chair's Soapbox

- Chris Sandberg, High Desert Council Board Chair

This is another report generated by the discussions at "The Thrive Summit" in Las Vegas that I attended as part of your Council Key 3 in mid-March, 2025.

The two Scouters who were Summit presenters from the corporate world–Brad Tilden of Alaska Airlines and Jon Bridges of Chick-fil-A-shared their experiences in working for successful businesses that face continuous challenges in keeping strong positions in competitive markets. They both noted similarities to Scouting America's history and current challenges: loss of a customer focus during growth, not seeing signs of decline and increasing risk, and attempting "quick fixes" that fail to address core issues.

They urged an increased commitment to Customer Focus. Jon presented a progression needed for success:

Employee Satisfaction -> Customer Satisfaction -> Customer Loyalty -> Growth

Translated for us as Scouters:

- Employees are our volunteer and professional Scouters, all of whom need to be satisfied in their roles and performing at a high level.
- Customers are the youth in Scouting and their associated adults, all of whom must have positive experiences in the program and see value in continuing.
- Loyalty is retention in units that are providing engaging program and personal development.
- Growth is the expansion of youth membership and adult volunteers.

For our dedicated volunteers, job satisfaction can be advanced by making their positions rewarding, ensuring that our processes make their work easier, and giving them solid training and on-the-job coaching.

For our young customers, we need quality control to ensure that all units provide program that emphasis fun, learning, challenges, and recognition. For our adult customers, we need to have clear communication about the Council, their unit, and their opportunities and responsibilities as part of the Scouting family.

For both those groups, our Training Committee and our Commissioner corps are keys to success, backed up by our Program Committee and professional staff.

When we have engaging and consistent program being delivered at every Pack, Troop, Crew, Ship, and Post, all of our customers will want to remain in Scouting. When youth are happy and parents see growth in their children, we will extend the tenure of our youngsters in Scouting and deepen the lifetime benefits they are accruing. Retention is the essential companion activity to recruiting: it is much easier to keep a customer than to get a new one!

Finally, when we have satisfied youth and parents, they will help us spread the word about how every child has a place in High Desert Scouting. We will then see growth from retention and from improved outreach and recruiting to new families. That will be the truest measure of the Council's success.
