#### REAL AMERICAN SCOUTING TRIVIA

Howard Lincoln was a thirteen-year-old boy selected during the 4th National Jamboree to pose as one of four scouts sleeping in their tents in this Norman Rockwell painting titled "The Scoutmaster. The painting was first published in a calendar in 1956.

Rockwell found a professional Scouter at the jamboree headquarters to pose as the Scoutmaster for the all-day photo shoot.

Lincoln eventually attained the rank of Eagle Scout and received the Distinguished Eagle Scout Award. He became the chairman of Nintendo of America and later the CEO of the Seattle Mariners.

## **Campout Safety Checklist**





May 2025 Safety Minute







## Summary

- Camping is a long-honored tradition for the Scouting America family.
  - Timing, supplies, and location should be determined ahead of time
  - There might be some instances where you overthink or underestimate a camping trip (better to overestimate?)
  - There are many ways to enjoy the adventure, fun, discovery, and teamwork involved
  - A campout safety checklist will help to ensure these aspects of camping are accomplished while keeping you safe

## Campout Safety Checklist Items

- Documentation Needed
  - Medical records, guidebooks, and permission slips
- Training
  - General training
    - Youth Protection training, CPR/first aid, and Hazardous Weather
  - Specific training
    - Trek Safely, Wilderness First Aid, Safety Afloat, Safe Swim Defense
- Planning
  - Become familiar with your campsite location
  - Research the weather, licensing/permit requirements, and project or activity guidelines









## Campout Safety Checklist Items

- Equipment
  - Plan for vehicles involved or tools necessary
  - Consider trailer requirements and first-aid or emergency kits
- Emergency Planning
  - Keep a cellphone handy
  - Prepare a list of local authorities (fire department, police, hospitals, etc.) in case an emergency occurs, such as inclement weather or a lost Scout
  - If you are in the backcountry, canyons, or a remote location, coverage may be one to two hours away. A GPS tracking/messaging device is helpful in these locations
- Program
  - Know your program. There should be age-appropriate activities, safety equipment, proper supervision, and a discussion on potential hazards









### Conclusion

- Proper planning will lead to a safer and more enjoyable camping experience
  - Use the Safety Checklist as a guide, but not the "be-all and end-all"
- Be mindful when taking Cubs camping
  - This may be the first time for Scouts, families and leaders to experience the outdoors
  - Younger Scouts may not be aware of "distractions" in the outdoors






#### **Council Wide Training Statistics**

  - If not current will show direct contact leaders as "Untrained"
  - 3/11/25 303 Leaders not current with SCO 800
  - 4/9/25 292 Leaders not current with SCO 800 – small step
  - 5/7/25 233 Leaders not current

  - 5 Registered without payment


















James M. Stewart Good Citizenship Award




### James Maitland Stewart



- Born 20 May 1908 in Indiana, Pennsylvania
- Died 2 July 1997
- Award winning American Broadway and film actor
  - 80 films starting in 1935
- Served in the Army Air Corps in World War II as a B-24 pilot
- Continued to serve after the war in the Air Force Reserve achieving Brigadier General

- Purchase and complete the award booklet
- Complete the Jimmy Stewart Museum Quiz (15 questions) and print
- Write an essay of 500 words or more on importance of citizenship as a Scout
- Do a good citizenship project in your community in honor of Jimmy Stewart and write a summary report of it
  - Complete the award application form










## How to Obtain the Award
