

Did You Know? Real American Scouting Trivia

The Cub Scout sign (the index and middle fingers extended in a V shape) symbolizes the ears of an **alert wolf**. It replaced the Indian "how" sign, which looked too much like the Nazi salute.

Cub Scouting: Two fingers: In Cub Scouting, we still use the two-finger sign and salute. **That hasn't changed**.

Why: The two raised fingers stand for the **Scout**Oath and the **Scout Law**. The fingers look like
the sharp ears of the wolf, ready to listen to
Akela.



Who: Cub Scouts and Cub Scout leaders

When: Give the Cub Scout sign each time you say the Scout Oath and Scout Law. It's also handy when you want to quiet a room quickly.

Also-Cub Scout salute: Two fingers together held above the brow.

Note: Lions also use the two-finger Cub Scout sign and salute.

Why we use a Safety Moment





September 2025 Safety Minute







Guidance

- Safety moments are a crucial component of Scouting America's Culture of Safety
 - They underscore our commitment to identifying, preventing, or mitigating hazards and risks in all Scouting activities
- We should initiate meetings and events with a brief pause to discuss potential dangers and how to avert them, focusing the group's attention on safety protocols





Different forms

Scouting Safely Resources

- Utilize the extensive library of ready-to-use safety moments on <u>Scouting Safely</u>, covering a myriad of topics
- These are regularly updated and expanded by Scouting America volunteers and professional staff

On-the-Spot Safety Moments:

- Scouts and Scouters can create ad-hoc safety moments tailored to specific situations or activities
- These "just in time" reminders can precede an activity, providing concise information or notifying participants of safety essentials like fire extinguisher locations and exits









Different forms

Localized Safety Moments:

- Develop safety moments at the local level for units, districts, councils, or camps
- These can align with local procedures or conditions, offering reminders during pre-activity assessments
- Camp leaders may plan a series of Safety Moments for each day, reinforcing important safety topics during camper orientation

External Resources Caution:

- While other organizations and companies may share safety moments online, exercise caution
- Ensure that these align with Scouting values and adhere to Scouting America safety guidelines







What defines a good moment?

- Conciseness: Limited to about one page and readable in 2 minutes or less
- Focus: Addresses a single topic or a specific aspect of a larger subject
- Audience Relevance: Tailored to the educational level of the audience
- Delivery: Crafted for Scouts to present to fellow Scouts, with some topics suitable for adult-to-adult communication
- Structure: Includes an opening statement, core information, a brief wrap-up, and at least one follow-up resource
- Non-Specificity: Avoids references to or about specific individuals
- Compliance: Conforms to Scouting America policies, practices, guidelines, and standards; excludes activities prohibited by Scouting America



I challenge each of us to Lead the Change happening in our council.












Council Wide Training Statistics + .1% since August

South Service Area Statistics +1.8%












Hazardous Weather



- To safely offer Scouting's outdoor program, however, you need a certain set of skills and knowledge – and that's why you're required to take Introduction to Outdoor Leader Skills (also known as "IOLS") Training. You'll learn how to build a fire, use an axe, cook outdoors, use a map and compass, responsibly care for the outdoors, and much more. Even if you weren't a Scout as a kid, you'll come out of this course looking and acting like a seasoned camper. This course, combined with Safeguarding Youth training (or YPT), Hazardous Weather, and the Scoutmaster/Assistant Scoutmaster-Specific Training course, will make you an "fully trained" Scouts BSA leader.
- Prerequisites: you must be currently registered in a Scouting unit and must be current in Safeguarding Youth Training and Hazardous Weather training.
- Deadline to register is end of day, September 27th, 2025. Sorry, no late registration will be accepted.

There will be no alcohol, tobacco, drugs, or caffeinated drinks allowed on the property per our agreement with the LDS Church








50-Miler Award











50-Miler Award



- Recognizes youth and adults who:
 - Complete 50 consecutive mile trek (afoot or afloat)
 - Complete 10 hours of conservation service on trek
 - If can't get in full 10 hours the remaining hours completed shortly after near home-town
 - Spend a minimum of 5 consecutive days on trail
 - Do not use any motors/power of any kind

50-Miler Award



- How to obtain the award
 - Visit website on previous slide
 - Download the application form at the more info link
 - Unit Leader fills it out and sends to either Council Office
 - Council verifies requirements are met and puts in unit's file
 - Unit leader (or designee) updates Scoutbook with who earned the award
 - Print purchase order and purchase at local Scout Shop
- Patch can not be worn on uniform...only backpack, patch blanket, patch vest, etc.


