Troop Leader Resources

New Troop Self-Assessments available!

Troop Self-Assessment surveys are short surveys that help your troop understand how well it's doing and where it can improve. They also give helpful tips and resources from Scouting America to make your program better.

Each survey has 9–12 questions and takes about 10 minutes to finish. Topics include Membership, Troop Meetings, Activities/Outings, Advancement, Patrols/Patrol Method, Youth Leaders, Scoutmaster Team, Troop Committee and Troop Administration/Finance. Troops can use them a few times a year, especially before planning their yearly activities. Leaders like the Scoutmaster and troop committee can also use the results to guide their meetings and decisions.

Training Trail



Scouting America's most essential training has a brand-new name and a fresh new look. What was previously known as Youth Protection Training (YPT) is now called Safeguarding Youth Training (SYT) – and it's more relevant than ever.

- Greater focus on Scouting's SAFE initiative
- Updated insights on technology and online threats
- Features real volunteers in real Scouting environments

The new 90 minute training is available now on my.scouting.org. Safeguarding Youth training must be taken every year. After the initial training session - subsequent annual refresher courses are about 15 minutes long. If a volunteer's Safeguarding Youth training is not current at the time of annual registration renewal, the volunteer will not be re-registered. Since then, Wood Badge has been held worldwide, providing advanced leadership training to thousands of Scout leaders. Wood Badge builds upon the best traditions and experiences of the Boy Scouts of America and also draws from a wide range of courses within and beyond the bounds of Scouting to present the latest in leadership theory and team development.

Eagle Recommendation Letters

There have been some changes in the Guide to Advancement regarding Requirement #2 on the Eagle Rank Application.

- "Scouts should list 4 people who know them personally and would be willing to provide a recommendation on their behalf."
- Who? Scout Leaders, teachers, employers, coaches, other Scouts, etc. Do not need to be 21 or older.
- The current Unit Leader or Committee Chair may NOT be one of the listed references, their signature on the application is their endorsement.
- Parents and other relatives are strongly discouraged from serving as references.
- A board of review must not be denied or postponed due to unresponsive references
- Per Section 9.0.1.7 of the GTA the Scout is responsible for requesting references from the four people listed on the application—this is a valuable life skill. Councils choose the method (letter, email, online form, etc.) and where submitted. The High Desert Council strongly prefers candidates use the letter method for references. This ensures that the letter has been written and signed by the author, is sealed in an envelope (for confidentiality) and sent to the designated unit recipient (either by hand or via mail). Each unit needs to determine who the appropriate recipient/keeper of the references should be prior to the Eagle Board of Review. There is legitimate concern that email can't guarantee authenticity and confidentiality. The High Desert Council does not totally rule out email since there may be extenuating circumstances.



The Chair's Soapbox

Here are some of the highlights of NAM:

Inspiration

The theme of the Meeting was "The Power of One": One Movement, One Mission, One Future!

Other messages:

- "It's time to connect with the American family."
- "We are Scouting's preservers."
- "Strong Units are the heart of Scouting."
- "When we build relationships, we change lives."

We have four Key Performance Metrics: youth safety, volunteer satisfaction, reduce debt, grow membership. They operate under five National Council pillars:

- Be A Leader in Safeguarding Youth
- · Change the Way We Work Together
- Make Our Programs Highly Relevant to Today's Youth
- Broaden Our Appeal and Revitalize Our Brand, and
- Strengthen our Financial Position.

David Montgomery was announced as Scouting America's official recruitment ambassador. He is a running back for the Detroit Lions and an Eagle Scout, who flashed the Scout Sign in the end zone during a game against the Green Bay Packers last December. Good News!

The years-long downward trend in membership was reversed in 2024, with an increase at the of the year to just over 1 million. 2025's target is 1,075,000, for 4.5% growth. The Big Hairy Audacious Goal: double membership in five years!

2024 was a positive year financially, helped significantly by the \$30 million Eli Lilly corporate grant. That grant from Lilly Endowment Inc. was awarded to help Scouting America build the character of the nation's young people under the "Character Development Through Youth Programs", a Lilly Endowment initiative designed to help youth-serving organizations create, test, implement and sustain strategies that support character development in the young people they serve in chapters and affiliates throughout the nation

Debt at National is being reduced ahead of schedule. In 2024, we paid \$10 million more than the scheduled payment, which saved us \$2 million in interest. The plan is to do the same in 2025. We have paid off almost \$100 million since bankruptcy. National is looking for a small overall positive financial result in 2025.

"Scoutly" - an Al agent is being tested in 7 Councils to assist new users with the online registration process, and will evolve into other applications. National won't make any more changes to the registration system this year.

A resource kit for Councils is out with content for Fall recruiting, based upon a July start.

45 new Membership District Executives are coming onboard in various Councils through the Eli Lilly fund's grant, and National is hoping to fund 10 more later this year. That is essential because DEs are Scouting America's on-the-ground sales force, and we have lost way too many in the last several years. High Desert Council applied for one of the grants but were not selected this year. And a new sales kit is underway.

Merit Badges are going digital: all Merit Badge pamphlets are now available as free PDFs. https://www.scouting.org/skills/merit-badges/all/. A brand-new AI Merit Badge is coming in the next month or so, and will cover AI basics, automation, ethics, deep fakes, career skills, and hands-on applications. A digital Aviation MB is in pilot. Scoutly will become an aid for helping Scouts move through requirements; MB counsellors will still be an essential part of the process.

A portion of the Lilly grant dollars will be spent improving BeAScout website, but that only works when leads are followed up immediately!

Updates

YPT has been replaced with Safeguarding Youth Training - SYT. The course went live this week, and takes about 85 minutes. We are moving toward an annual renewal process where you take the new course and pass the test. On the first anniversary of your SYT completion, you take a 15-minute refresher and pass a test. Scouters who are current on YPT do not have to take the new course – you have a full year of credit if you have just taken YPT (but you can take the new course now). The new SYT program incorporates the S.A.F.E. acronym and focuses on adult supervision and youth abuse prevention. "Our job as volunteers is to be smoke detectors, not firefighters." Its look and feel are very different from YPT and its aim is to empower the great Scouting family to enjoy the magic of Scouting in a safe way.

SYT covers peer-on-peer abuse, but a new Peer-on-Peer Youth Training program is coming soon.

Consider attending the Safety Conference at the Philmont Training Center near Cimarron, NM, September 14-17,2025.

Scouting America is cooperating with Scouts Canada and Scouts (UK) to develop new programs, to hear success stories in programming and youth safety.

The Combined Troop pilot is well underway, and a comprehensive report will be done in September. The revised Cub program has been well received. National will kickoff a trial of "Catalyst" for 20+ year-olds later in 2025. The "Squirrels" program for 4-6 year-olds will be introduced as family/home activities outside of a Pack. National will be doing focus groups asking about uniforms in 2025, and will be surveying Scouts BSA ré program similar simplification along the lines of the new Cub program. Also in testing: Seasonal Scouting - a 12-week program for Cubs in sports/other activities, Outdoor Clubs - Scouting without the traditional trappings, and Community Scouting for short-term access.

A brand-new set of Den Meeting Resource Decks was displayed. There is a deck of 116 cards for each of the ranks of Cub Scouts. Each deck includes resource cards, cards for the six required adventures and activities of each rank, cards for 4 to 5 electives, and fun and game cards. Each card includes supply lists, preparation time estimates, and QR codes for further help. These decks should make preparing for and conducting den meetings easier for Den Leaders and more fun for Cub Scouts. A Scouting for Food/National Day of Service in November is being planned, along with a "10 Million Hours Of Service" project for the 250th national anniversary in 2026. No details at this point. (Continued on next page)

2026 National Jamboree - July 22 to July 31, 2026:

- there are scholarships for attendees, and a funding program for those;
- staff registrations turned in by the end of May will be in a lottery for roofed housing!

Scouting America is developing a national marketing/membership campaign for ESPN, YouTube TV, Disney+, Hulu and other channels.

The opportunity for Councils to start conducting raffles is being reviewed.

No consideration is being given to dropping Citizenship in Society Merit Badge or removing it as Eagle-required.

Councils are moving to a two-year charter renewal process; no change for Units. The long-promised update to Council bylaws is finally coming in 2025.

Sobering Facts

- In focus groups, the Scouting America logo had very low recognition, and parents were not generally aware of how their children could join. Scouting had good impressions on camping, outdoor activities, leadership, and character, but there was low willingness to volunteer. Parents reported spending between \$200 and \$2,100 for non-Scouting youth activities that lasted 8-10 weeks. Time constraints were reported as a barrier to considering Scouting, with many youth already in multiple activities.
- 2024 got a grade of "B" for example, only 43% of volunteers surveyed reported positive satisfaction!
- In a ranking of financial, membership, and other criteria, 108 Councils are Vulnerable or At Risk; 128 are Healthy or Stable (HDC is ranked as Stable).
- New Units are the key to growth, especially for Cub Scout Packs. The number of Units is down 50% since 2019, while average sizes stayed steady. The key is to identify places where new Units can be started.
- We lose 50% of new members in the first 6 months, mainly Cubs. Trained leaders delivering quality program from the get-go is the cure.
- 56% of Councils operated at a deficit in 2024 (including HDC), and 83% of those had declines in revenue since 2019. Membership growth is the key to reversing those statistics!
